# BROME and OAKLEY PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of Brome and Oakley Parish Council held at 7.30 pm on **Monday 13 June 2016** in Brome and Oakley Village Hall.

PRESENT: Councillors Ursula Halton (Chairman), Charles Doe, David Hardaker and Mark Prior. Also in attendance Sarah Foote (Clerk), Mid Suffolk District Councillor David Burn (left 19.50) and Suffolk County Councillor Jessica Fleming (arrived 20.35).

### 1. Apologies for absence

Apologies were received from Cllr Parry and accepted by the Council.

- 2. <u>Declarations of pecuniary and other interests from members on any item to be discussed and requests</u> for dispensations. There were no declarations.
- 3. Councillors were reminded of the requirement to individually update their Register of Interests as appropriate.

## 4. Approval of minutes

The minutes from the meeting of 9 May 2016 were agreed as a true record by those present.

5. Matters arising from minutes of 9 May 2016 - None.

#### 6. PUBLIC FORUM

<u>Mid Suffolk District Council</u> - Cllr Burn reported the Joint Strategic Plan had been reviewed and the priority outcomes were; business growth and increased productivity, community building engagement, assets and investments, housing and delivery, and an enabled and efficient organisation. The Portfolio structure had been changed to align with the priorities of the Plan. There would be two other Portfolios, Finance and Environment. Cllr Burn would be the Portfolio Holder for Environment. Cllr Burn informed Councillors that outline planning permission had been granted for 280 new homes on land at Eye Airfield. A screening opinion had been submitted to the Planning Department for the erection of a feed mill at Eye Airfield. This would determine if an Environmental Impact Assessment was needed in conjunction with any future planning application.

There were no members of the public present.

If devolution was successful, Social and Health care services would be reformed, Public Transport would be reviewed and more powers would be available to Parish Councils. Public Consultation would be held in July and August and the Secretary State would determine in 2017. The Chairman also gave details of how Section 106 funds were to mitigate development on site and CIL funds would mitigate and improve matters from developments off site.
